

How you can help your child at home

- We would like to stress the importance of listening to your child read regularly at home. If your child enjoys reading to themselves, please refer to the Reading Diary for suitable questions you can ask them. Reading supports everything they do in class, particularly their writing.
- Please also continue to read to your child.
- Retelling familiar stories in their own words or using the pictures in a book.
- Counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s forwards and backwards.
- Practise 2, 5, 3 and 10 times tables.
- Learn by heart pairs of numbers making 10 and then 20, and then 100, such as $5 + 5$, $15 + 5$, $50 + 50$
