Theme Overview

In this topic, children will study of one of the most significant periods in the history of the UK in which the right for equal suffrage was long fought for and won. Through the book, *Suffragette: The Battle for Equality*, children will discover leading and less renowned characters from the past, and understand the events which led to women achieving suffrage. They will then use the historical knowledge gained to make links to more recent battles for equality, and ponder whether it is ever okay to break the rules, if they are unfair.

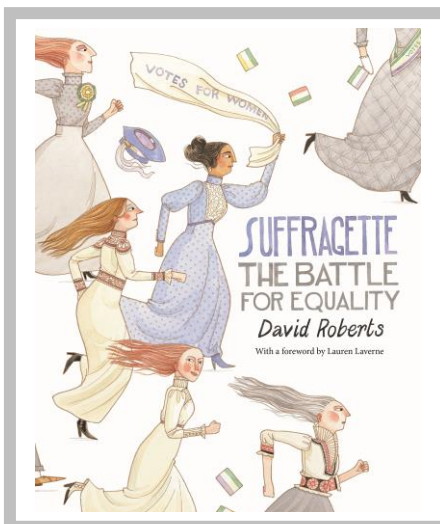

HOOK INTO LEARNING
