As a family we will:

- ensure that our child arrives at school every day, ready to start at 8:55am and wearing school uniform
- provide an explanation by 9 am should our child be absent
- ensure that our child is ready for school e.g. a good sleep, adequate breakfast.
- attend consultation evenings
- support our child in homework tasks
- make the school aware of any concerns or problems that might affect our child's learning and behaviour
- ensure family holidays are not taken during term time.
- support the aims and ethos of the school
- encourage and celebrate independence
- encourage a positive attitude towards our child's education and our school.
- read information provided to us by the school
- inform the school immediately of any changes to parents and carers arrangements and emergency contact details
- ensure our child follows the school's policy on acceptable computer and internet use
- ensure that our child leaves items of value including mobile phones, toys etc at home
- support the school approach to online safety and not upload or add any school based text, image, sound or videos that could upset or offend **any** member of the school community, or bring the school name into disrepute.
- ensure that our online activity (Facebook, Whatsapp, Mums net etc) would not cause the school, staff, pupils or others distress or bring the school community into disrepute.

As a pupil, I will try my best by:

- being prepared for school and bringing all the equipment I need every day
- wearing my school uniform with pride and being tidy in appearance
- doing all my class work and homework as well as I can
- respecting other children's culture, race, feelings, beliefs and values
